Holocaust Remembrance Association (HRA18)

Sensitizing hearts to the issues of the Holocaust through education, healing, and reconciliation



The vision of HRA18 is to see the world inspired to stand in solidarity against persecution, prejudice, and indifference.

The core purpose of the organization is to create UPSTANDERS – individuals who will stand against antisemitism as well as persecution and prejudice in all forms.

Three of the principal projects of HRA18 are:

- The March of Remembrance Texas is part of the international March of Life movement founded by Nazi descendant Jobst Bittner of Tübingen, Germany. The memorial walks are taken annually to commemorate Holocaust and Genocide Awareness on streets and university campuses. We Remember by giving survivors of the Holocaust a voice; Reconciliation occurs between victims, perpetrators and their descendants as we Take a Stand for Israel and against today's antisemitism.
- The Holocaust Garden of Hope in Kingwood, Texas illustrates for children the experiences of children during the Holocaust at the Jasenovac Camp and other European locations using painting, sculpture, music, and physical structures in a way that honors those who survived, serves as memorial to the victims, educates the public, and compels visitors to say, "Never again!" in their own communities.
- The HRA18 Scholarships have been established in Houston and Dallas area universities and secondary schools. These partnerships focus on raising awareness of Holocaust issues for our future leaders through primary source and active learning experiences.
- The Upstander Stone Project—1.5 million stones are being painted by volunteers from corporations, schools, clubs, nursing homes, etc. throughout Texas and beyond for the Holocaust Garden of Hope Upstander Stone Project. There will be many spots in the Holocaust Garden of Hope where visitors can view the stones and begin to understand the huge number of innocent lives lost.
